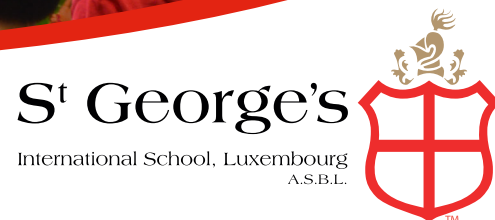

School Medicals

Dear Parents,

Please be advised that the next school medicals will be:-

Year 5U – 16 March 2017,

Year 3K – 6 March 2017 Year 3B – 23 March 2017 Year 3H – 30 March 2017

Year 1 and Reception will be notified at a later date.

Dr Welter carries out the medicals along with a nurse from the Ministry. At no point are the children left alone with any adult. There are no injections during this medical. The medical consists of Height, Weight, a brief eye test, a full body growth check including checking the spine. Boys will have a short testicular check to ensure all is well. The pupils are asked to undress to their underwear, a T-shirt may be kept on. If you have any questions please contact the Nurse's Office.

Raffle Prize Donations for Y4, 5 and 6 Easter Ball

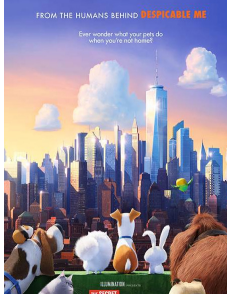

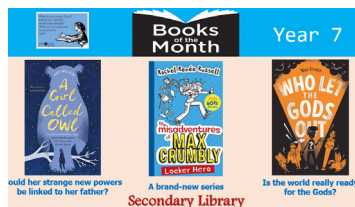

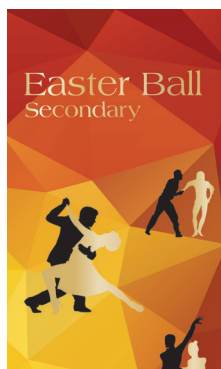

From the 10th - 12th of March there will be an international figure skating competition “Coupe du Printemps” at the Kockelscheuer ice rink.

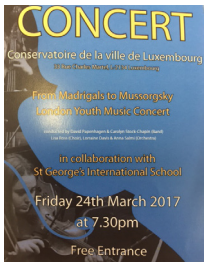
