Message from the Principal

Dear Parents,

Welcome to the second week of the newsletter – you may have noticed some changes in the layout to make it more accessible. Students across the school are enjoying the fine September weather and the outside areas are being used very well indeed. We have had our first assemblies in the new auditorium and drama students are being taught there as well. Our first trips away from school have already gone out and more are planned for later in the month; the rationale behind this is to spread the organisational load of these excursions more evenly across the academic year.

Over the summer we have had some work done to install automatic closing at Gate 2 to improve our security in the mornings and afternoons. Time: 3:30-5:00pm | Cost: 150 euro / term | Started Monday 12th September

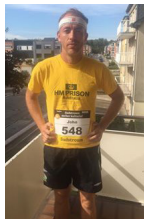
This club gives students two options:
